Artistic Bike Racks Arrive in Downtown!

Riding a bike into downtown Easton just got easier thanks to the efforts of Easton Main Street's Design Committee. Four artistic bike racks were recently unveiled as part of a project undertaken earlier this year by the group. Led by project leader Sandy Levisay, the committee asked for submissions from local artists to create unique yet functional bike racks which would also be works of art.

Easton-area artists Eric Cuper, Karel Mikolas and Jason Farnsworth were commissioned to create the custom-designed bicycle racks which will be placed at Centre Square; South Third Street near the parking garage; at the Fowler Literacy Center on Ferry Street; and adjacent to the Grand Eastonian Suites Hotel on Northampton Street.

Funding for the bike racks was provided by Crayola, Inc., Sam's Club, the Greater Lehigh Valley Chamber of Commerce, and the Mayor's Cultural Arts Committee via the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts.

The Design Committee is in the early stages of developing three more bike racks with the Environmental Advisory Council's Transportation Affinity Circle and hopes to unveil them by mid-2010.

Carriage Rides Bring Holiday Charm Back to Downtown

Horse-drawn carriage rides return to the city's downtown district for the holiday season. Back by popular demand, the carriage rides take place every Friday evening between Thanksgiving and Christmas. That means four chances for you to take the family or your special someone on a scenic ride through the city's historic downtown district.

Rides are 15 minutes long and cost \$10 per person. Or get the entire carriage to yourself for \$40. Carriages hold 4-6 people depending on age and size. Carriages depart from Centre Square in front of Valenca restaurant from 5 - 9 p.m. on Nov. 27 and Dec. 4, 11 and 18.

Tickets can be purchased at Partyology, 230 Northampton Street. To ensure a ride this season, buy your tickets early.

Carolers will also help set a festive mood so come downtown and experience Easton during the holiday season. It'll be like a page right out of a Charles Dickens story!

Take a Moment to Share Your Thoughts With Us

Earlier this year, Easton Main Street's Economic Restructuring Committee began a customer intercept survey project to ascertain the opinions of folks visiting the downtown. The goal of the surveys is to aid in business recruitment and the formation of a more complete shopping/dining district in downtown Easton.

Ten downtown retailers and restaurants are currently participating in the project as are the Easton Farmer's Market and the Easton Ambassadors. Survey questions focus on customer shopping habits, parking preferences and what types new of businesses people would like to see in downtown Easton.

While the customer intercept surveys will continue for the next several months, early feedback included the following:

- The majority of customers attending the Easton Farmers' Market parked on-street, had little difficulty finding available parking spaces, and visited one or more downtown shops or restaurants while in town.
- In-store customer surveys showed an overwhelming desire for a women's apparel store in downtown Easton.
- Requests for a grocery store and diner came in at a close second.
- Some of the other types of businesses on the "Wish List" included: jewelry & accessories, shoes, yarn/knitting, new books, bakery, cheese shop, specialty wine, art supplies, sporting goods, music, used cds, movie theatre, comedy club and drycleaners.

Look for survey forms and signs reading "Main Street Wants to Know" at downtown businesses and tell us what you would like to see enhance our beautiful downtown shopping district. You may also be approached by one the Easton Ambassadors who are interviewing visitors as they walk the streets of downtown.



Easton Main Street is Movin' On Up!

At the end of October the office for the Easton Main Street Initiative will be relocating from its current location on Northampton Street to 35 S. Third Street.
